Motice ThinkSpace! lead by the charity Sparkfish have been in school this week. We all had a session in their calming zone with activities to notice our emotions


Give We have planted mint seeds to grow on at home. Don't forget to gift your mint plant to a friend or family member for them to enjoy a cup of mint tea.



We had the pleasure of welcoming the Polka Theatre into our school! Reception children took part in a workshop linked to our topic of Traditional Tales. We went on a story hunt, and used our eyes and ears to help us find the clues to the different stories. We retold and acted out the Princess and the Pea. Goldilocks and the Three Bears and the Gingerbread man. At the end of the session, we created our own story using all of the different props!







In year 1, we have been learning all about castles this half term. We have explored different types of castles, their features and different roles in medieval castles. 


World Book Day Thursday 6th March
