Online Safety Spotlight

The Easter holidays are a great time for children to enjoy extra screen time, but it's important to make sure they stay safe online. Here's a quick guide for parents to ensure that kids enjoy their time online responsibly:

1. Set Clear Boundaries

- Screen time limits: Set a time limit for how long your child can be online each day.
- Content restrictions: Make sure to guide them on which apps, websites, and games are appropriate for their age

2. Monitor What They Do

- Check their activities: Regularly ask what apps, websites, or games they've been using.
- **Privacy settings:** Help them set their devices and apps to "private," so strangers can't see their information or contact them.

3. Teach About Personal Information

- What's okay to share: Explain to your child that they should never share personal details like their name, address, school, or phone number online.
- Safe usernames: Encourage the use of fun usernames that don't give away personal details.

4. Use Parental Controls

- **Set up filters:** Use built-in parental controls on websites, apps, and devices to limit the content your child can access.
- Review game ratings: Check the age ratings on games or apps to make sure they're suitable.

5. Have Regular Check-ins

- Stay involved: Spend time playing games or watching videos with your child to understand what they're doing.
- Open conversations: Let them know they can come to you if they ever feel uncomfortable or see something tr
- Don't share passwords: Remind them that they should never share passwords with anyone, even friends.

By setting clear rules, monitoring their activity, and talking openly about online safety, you can help your child have a fun and safe experience this Easter holiday.

Why Active Travel?

The research compiled by Sustrans shows that active travel to school makes children more alert and ready to face the school day than if they had arrived in a car.

"Walking, cycling or scooting to school wakes up the mind and body".

Active travel to school can increase concentration by up to 4 hours and just 15 minutes of exercise can improve a child's mood.

Physical activity can encourage healthy growth and development, maintain a healthy weight and reduce anxiety and stress. It can improve musical strength, endurance and flexibility in children and adolescents.

Years 3, 4 and 6 have now had their outdoor learning sessions in the woodland area. Year 3 were using their knowledge of hieroglyphics and cave paintings to decorate the fence in the woodland area using chalk and charcoal.

In Year 2, the children have been exploring plants in science this term. They observed a range of seeds and bulbs to identify differences between them. They learnt that seeds and bulbs have a store of energy that they use to begin growth.






Year 3

This week in Year 3 was an exciting one! We finally finished writing our explanation texts on plants as well as looking at angles and types of lines in maths. In geography, we created information pages all about rivers and presented them in our own original ways. In science we planned and started an investigation to see how fluid travels up through a plant. We used celery sticks and blue food colouring to check how fast it will travel through the celery stick.

In PSHE we played the budget game where we had to survive for 12 weeks without going into debt - we realised that we cannot buy everything we want all at once! We have to save patiently.

Over the last few weeks, Year 4 have been working incredibly hard when writing their own historical narratives. They have carefully planned each section and ensured they have included each of our writing tools. We have been very impressed to see the vast array of stories that have been created.

Year 5 and the Key Stage 2 Eco councillors were busy this week enhancing the school environment. They has so much fun digging and removing a patch of grass and preparing it to receive wildflowers, a mix of 42 seeds. This new bed will be a haven for pollinators as well as looking beautiful! Foxes enjoyed their morning session so much they offered to dig in their lunchtime playtime. Thank you to all!





Year 6

Year 6 had a fabulous time in the Woodland area with Mrs Cooke this week. They carried out an experiment to see which natural materials would be best to insulate a jar of warm water (which represented the body of a mouse). They also made their own animals out of clay and natural resources. We think they look wonderful!









Arts Week











What is a Parent Rep?	A Parent Rep is a key link between parents and the school. It's a simple but important role—you'll help gather feedback, share ideas, and bring any concerns from other parents to the Parent Farum. You don't need any special experience, just a willingness to listen, char with other parents, and share their thoughts in a supportive and constructive way.
