Our School Aims:

Our One School Rule:

At Hatchlands, we believe that education is a partnership between pupils, parents and the school.

We believe that if the children are working to their full potential in school hours, then a corresponding amount of 'down time' is essential for an acceptable work/life balance, however some form of home learning is required to consolidate and deepen the learning experiences at school.

Aims and Objectives:

- Ensure that parents are clear about what their child is expected to do
- Ensure that there is consistency and progression across the school
- Use homework as a tool to help to continue to raise attainment
- Extend learning opportunities beyond the school day
- Reinforce work covered in class by providing further opportunities
- Practise or consolidate basic skills and knowledge

It is important that children get into a routine of completing regular Home Learning activities. The schedule is deliberately set to allow the child and family the flexibility to complete the activities either during the week or at the weekend.

Teachers set weekly Home Learning activities on a <u>Friday with</u> the expectation that their work is brought into school by the following **Wednesday**.

Teachers will share home learning activities in class each week and mark the homework so children and parents can see how successful they have been and areas they may need further practise with.



Reading:

We ask that every child reads their books from school at least 3 times a week. We encourage children to re-read their books to develop their fluency and love of reading. School and home will write comments in the child's reading record each time they read.








Your child will be given a bookmark which lists the 'red words' they must practise reading by sight as they cannot be sounded out. The children need to be able to read these words in order to move reading levels. They will be provided with a new book mark when they move reading levels.





Children in Reception will be sent home with a name writing card to help them to recognise and practise writing their name.

Children in Reception will have books to help them to practise writing skills. This will initially start with learning how to write individual letters and numbers, then move on to practising short words.




Children will be given a selection of words to practise reading at pace. These should be kept in their book bags so they can be practised at school too. When the children are secure with these words, they will be provided with new words.



Children in Year 1 and Year 2 will have a small book to practise writing sentences using some of the words included in their word packswords included in their word packs.



Children in Year 1 and Year 2 will have one piece of Maths homework every other week. Some example tasks include:



All children in KS1 will have access to Numbots which supports children in developing their number understanding, recall and fluency.



TT Rockstars:

All children from Year 1 will have access to TT Rockstars which supports children in regular times tables practise. We ask that children engage with this at least once a week.

Children from Year 2 onwards, will have weekly spellings to practise at home. These will be words that fit their spelling rule they have recently learnt, frequently used words within their writing or words they find difficult to spell. They will not sit a weekly spelling test, instead they will be required to show they have learnt them within their day to day writing. Throughout the year, children may revisit previous words if they need further practise.

From KS2, children will have a weekly English or Maths task to complete. These will alternate between English and Maths each week and will focus on recent learning in school which we would like the children to practice and consolidate.
